Map Hike for 2002

Map Hike is an opportunity to enjoy orienteering in between our regularly scheduled events. Each year club volunteers under the direction of Phil Wolfling put up markers in three county parks: Emery, Chestnut Ridge, and the Erie County Forest.

Each park has about 25 markers placed at a wide variety of topographic features. The locations are printed on a map and the map is then sold for \$5 a copy.

Using the map you can visit the park and locate the markers any time it is convenient for you. Because you are under no pressure from a clock you can spend as little or as much time as you want. Each control has a two-letter code printed on it so you can prove you visited the control. If you are able to find all of the controls in a park you mail in a post card with the codes and you are entered in a drawing for prizes.

The controls are in place from our first meet, May 5 this year, until the Saturday after Thanksgiving. Then the controls are removed and the following year put up in different locations.

Map Hikes are sold at all events or are available by mail order from Phil. Call him at 832-9758 to order or to get more information.

Oh yes, by the way, if you'd like to volunteer to help Phil put out the markers or trace the maps, he'd love to hear from you.

Winter Meeting Minutes

January 12, 2002

Attendees: Carl Matthies, Lisa Matthies, Greg Hyatt, Andy Grupp (President), Janet Sundquist (Newsletter Editor), Jon Sundquist, Mike Lance, Phil Wolfling (Secretary), Dave Levine, Rebecca Wightman

Elections: All officers had agreed to be re-elected for another year:

Andy Grupp, President

Mike Gasiewicz, Treasurer

Phil Wolfling, Secretary

Members voted in favor of re-election with a round of applause.

These election results will be put in the newsletter. It was later

noted that Dave Cady had volunteered to be Newsletter Editor.

Rebecca Wightman had volunteered to be meeting minutes

recorder.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Mike Gasiewicz was absent.

New Business

1. Finances: Andy reported that Mark Dominie was 2/3 done with updating the map of Schoellkopf Boy Scout Camp, and had been paid \$1,100 towards his total fee of \$1,600. The new map will be on the computer program O-CAD, delivered to the club on computer disk.

2. Meet Directors: Dave Cady (Membership Coordinator) requests that directors give him membership renewal information so that people do not get dropped from the mailing list by mistake. Also, directors need to get meet results to the Newsletter Editor on time.

3. Membership: It was agreed that memberships run from the January 1 through December 31 calendar year. Renewal memberships may be paid at a spring meet for that calendar year. New memberships paid at a fall meet will run through the following calendar year, however. This policy will be stated in the newsletter. A discussion of membership benefits included: discounts at meets, the newsletter with meet information and voting privileges. Also, the membership form may be revised.

4. Newsletter: Dave Cady had volunteered to be Editor, and will send out the newsletter four times a year.

5. Rochester Orienteering Club: Andy Grupp reported that he has not contacted the ROC regarding possible merging of activities, etc. as discussed at the fall meeting. Dave Levine had attended the ROC Annual Meeting. He reported that they are planning a 2003 ROGAINE in Allegany State Park. The Buffalo Club is invited to help out by doing the technical portion (control setting, etc.) Rochester will do all the administrative work. Andy Grupp asked Dave to set up a meeting between some ROC and BFLO members to discuss this.

6. Meet Dates, 2002: (See article on page one.)

7. Schoellkopf: Regarding digital printing of the new map, Jon Sundquist found out from Mark Dominie that maps can be run in smaller runs (100s instead of 1000s) than conventional printing. Greg Hyatt will get more information from his Graphic Designer.

Dave Levine noted that some clubs print maps at the meets. Jon said Digicon was used for the Allegany maps due to the large format.

8. Web Site Committee: Greg Hyatt, Jon Sundquist, Andy Grupp and Phil Wolfling volunteered to form a committee to discuss a web site for the Club. Dave Levine said that through the USOF we can have a name in the form: "bflo.us.orienteering.org". (Note: "usof.orienteering.org" was mentioned during the meeting, but when writing up the minutes it was found to be "us.orienteering.org") The International Orienteering Federation has the name "orienteering.org".

9. Next Map: Jon suggested Sprague Brook. He will ask the County for permission. Phil Wolfling will find out who the Park Manager is and run it by him. Volunteers for the Sprague Brook Map Committee are: Andy Grupp, Jon Sundquist, and Dave Levine. Mapping costs were discussed, and whether to ask Mark Dominie or a European mapper.

10. Spring Meeting Date: Saturday, April 20, 2002 will be the next meeting. A central meeting location is to be determined.

11. Other Business:

A. Dave Levine mentioned the issue of competitors not returning with the time limit was discussed at the ROC meeting. The problem is that meet directors do not know if competitors are lost or injured, or may have left without checking in. Janet Sundquist volunteered to put together some safety rules for the Club.

B. Phil Wolfling asked for volunteers to help with the Map Hike. Rebecca Wightman volunteered. Phil will be redoing the control post cards this year.

C. Publicity: Janet Sundquist noted that the USOF is making press release packets for local clubs for National Orienteering Day. Rebecca Wightman will order one and have it sent to Phil Wolfling. Phil will contact Will Elliot of the Buffalo News Outdoors Page to do an article.

D. Phil Wolfling will purchase a couple compasses for the Club to lend at meets, and also a couple for prizes for Map Hike 2001. Map Hike winners were chosen in a random drawing after the business meeting.
